PROGRAMME B

This particular programme is aimed at children who have already attended Programme A during which they had the opportunity to come into contact with the basic concepts of modern art. Through interactive courses of theoretical and practical content, as well as visits to the exhibition halls of NiMAC, the participants will get acquainted with new ways of thinking and will have the opportunity to further develop the techniques to which they were initiated with the first programme sessions.

ENGRAVING

THEATRE WORKSHOP

Through theatre, the children have the opportunity to learn to work collectively and get better acquainted with team work, while at the same time they enjoy themselves and have fun by getting to know better both themselves and the world.

PHOTOGRAPHY

The children will construct their own pinhole camera and will use the darkroom to develop their photos. Through a creative dialogue with their teacher, the camera and themselves, they will be equipped with the necessary technical knowledge so as to be able to discover their individual way of expression.

The program includes: • Light painting technique • Construction of a pinhole camera • Dark room • Black-and-white photos and their developing • Screening of a documentary on photography • Techniques of zoom-in and zoom-out • Techniques of diaphragms and speed • Art photography and image composition • Lighting • Abstract photography • Various art photography techniques.
